When you enable Discovery Education *streaming's* **Closed Captioning**, the video player will display the audio portion of the video as text right below the video image. With Closed Captioning, you can address the different learning needs of students and enhance comprehension as students read, listen, and view video content.

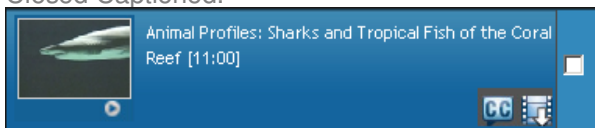
In the Classroom

Provide a critical link to social studies, math, language arts, science, and health content for hearing impaired students by enabling Closed Captioning in Discovery Education *streaming* videos. Use Closed Captioning as a tool to enhance the following reading skills with ESOL students:

- reading comprehension
- word recognition
- decoding skills
- listening comprehension
- vocabulary acquisition

Play a Closed Captioned Video Segment on a Mac:

Step 1: Search for a Closed Captioned video on Discovery Education *streaming*. The “CC” icon indicates the video is Closed Captioned.



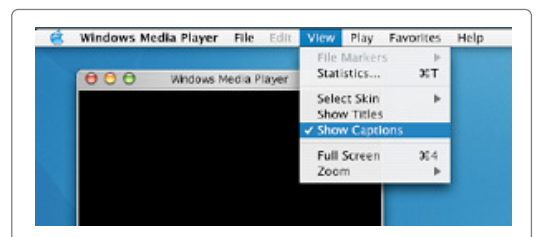
Step 2: Click the “CC”, located under the player window.

Step 3: Select “Windows Media” for the Media Type Selection.

Step 4: Select  for the video to play within the Media Player.

Step 5: Click the **Play** icon next to the video segment you wish to view. Windows Media Player will open a new window.

Step 6: In Windows Media Player, select the “View” menu and select “Show Captions.”



The ability to view Closed Captioning while watching downloaded videos is currently unavailable.
